- 112 units of training in Ortho-Bionomy which includes:
 - 32 units of Phase Four
 - 16 units of Phase Five
 - 16 units of Phase Six
 - The balance of the units should be from the required classes in the Registered Practitioner Training Program.
- One satisfactory session of Ortho-bionomy given to a Registered Ortho-bionomy Instructor.
- Sign and return a copy of the *Trademark Guidelines* and *Code of Ethics* forms (new members only).

Continuing Education Requirements (CEU's):

- Associate Members must complete 16 units of continuing education in Ortho-Bionomy every two years.
